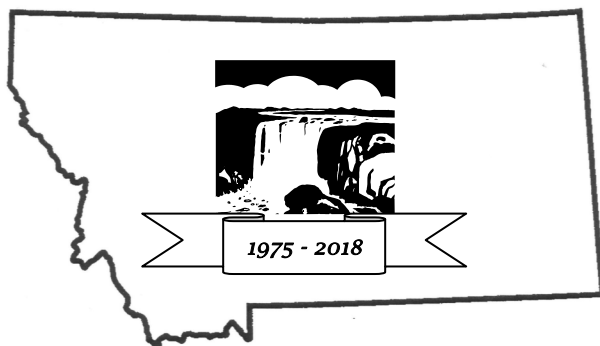

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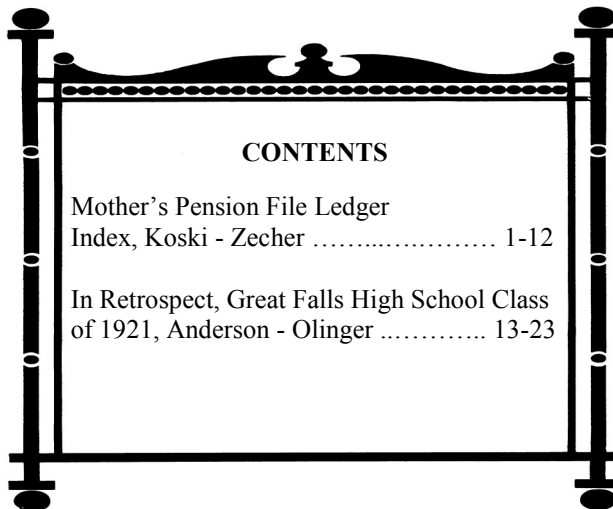

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**GENEALOGY LIBRARY.** The Genealogy Library is located on the third floor of the Great Falls Public Library. The library is staffed entirely by volunteers. Hours are Tuesday through Saturday, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

**MEETINGS.** Monthly general meetings and programs are scheduled the second Thursday of each month, September through May, at 6:00 p.m. Guests and visitors are always welcome.

**Research Policy**

Researchers will complete a comprehensive search of the records available at the Great Falls Genealogy Society library.

The fee is \$35.00 per immediate family.

Photocopies of obituaries, marriage license/certificates and birth and death certificates are \$5.00 each if ordered separately.

Research will commence upon receipt of the fees; check or money order can be sent to our Great Falls office. Payment by PayPal is also available.

Any additional search of local records readily available at the Cascade County Courthouse *requires an additional fee and additional time.* Other fees may apply if the request is extensive.

**ANDERSON, Marcus Christian** was born on May 21, 1902, to Marcus and Minnie (Lundberg) Anderson, who lived at 1117 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue South, Great Falls. He took the general course of study in high school. He later married Nina Constance **SJOBLOM** on June 30, 1927 in Great Falls. He died on December 14, 1934, at Great Falls, of a cerebral hemorrhage. At the time of his death he was a bank teller in Great Falls (Findagrave.com). His funeral was arranged by the George Company, with his Masonic brothers presiding at the Highland Cemetery burial. His wife, born at Twodot, MT, died at age 82 on June 10, 1983 at Great Falls. She had served as a secretary for Lee M. Ford for many years (George Company records, familysearch.org). ~

**ARNDT, Paul F.** was born January 27, 1904, to Frank and Agnes (Novganski) Arndt. They lived at 414 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue Southwest. Paul's work in the Manual Training Program at Great Falls High School was featured in a February 19, 1921 (p. 10) news article. His father, Frank Arndt, belonged to the local Catholic Council (GF Tribune, 11/14/1921, p. 5). A September newspaper stated that Paul F. Arndt was going to attend Montana School of Mines at Butte. At late as 1940 Paul worked as a pharmacist in Great Falls. He had married Iva Marie **BANE** on July 31, 1939 at Helena. Paul died in Cut Bank, MT, on March 28, 1967, and was buried there at Crown Hill Cemetery. His wife Iva was also buried there in 1971 (MT Death Index; Findagrave.com; CD).~

**ARNOLD, Alice Margaret** was born August 16, 1903, to Charles H. and Margaret Arnold. Their address was 809 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue North. She majored in the Scientific course of study at Great Falls High School. In the 1930 Great Falls census she was living with her parents and working as a stenographer. She married Finley **MACDONALD** in 1937, and they had a daughter, age 1, by April, 1940. In 1942 Finley was the office manager of the ACM Wire and Cable Company in Great Falls. Alice was a doll collector, and belonged to Great Falls Flower Growers and the American Legion Auxiliary. They had two children—Mary Margaret (Teague), and Charles. Alice died August 24, 1990 in Great Falls and was buried at Mt. Olivet Cemetery. (SD; CD; U.S. Census; Ancestry.com; Great Falls Tribune obituary, August 25, 1990, p. 4). ~

**ARTHUR, Julia Downing** was born October 14, 1903 at Neihart, Montana, to George W. and Margaret G. (Downing) Arthur; they lived at 610 7<sup>th</sup> St. North in Fall, 1920. She took the general course of study in high school. She was a member of the "Honor Ten" in her graduating class. Both Julia and her sister Margaret were employed as public school teachers in Great Falls, as shown in the 1930 U.S. Census. In the 1940 U.S. Census at Great Falls, she was noted as a single public school teacher at Whittier Elementary, and had her sister Margaret living in her household. They had lived at the same address five years earlier. Julia married Carl W. Connors of Helena at Choteau on June 12, 1948. They later lived in El Paso, Texas, where she died in February, 1993. She was interred at Restlawn Memorial Park in El Paso. They had been in El Paso since at least 1953, according to city directory entries. (SC; U.S. Census; MT Marriages; NY Passenger Lists, August 2, 1930; CD; Findagrave.com).~

**ASKEW, Irvine Dunham** was born to Irving and Pearl (Kirkhuff) Askew on May 20, 1903. He majored in the commercial course of study at Great Falls High School. The January 16, 1920 U.S. Census recorded him as a 16-year-old boarder in the Margaret and Josephine Trigg household. In 1923 he worked at the Great Falls Iron Works; the Thursday before his death he started work at the Smelter in Great Falls. He drowned at the popular Sun River Bathing Beach on July 26, 1923, and was buried in the family plot out at Chestnut Cemetery. (Familysearch.org; George Company records, Great Falls Tribune, July 27, 1923, p. 12; July 28, 1923, p. 7; BillionGraves.com). ~

**AUERBACH, Helen C.** Helen planned to attend St. Catherine's College in St. Paul, beginning Fall, 1921. Born November 6 1904 in Great Falls, she took the general course of study in high school. She was married to Dr. Lloyd F. **HOLZBERGER**, a dentist, on August 19, 1925 in Cascade County. Her parents were Frederick and Theresia Auerbach, as noted in the 1920 U.S. Census. They were still in Great Falls in 1940. She lived in Great Falls until 1989, when she moved to Helena to be near her daughter, Joyce. She died there in late April, 1999 (CD; SC; obituary).~

**BABB, Bernice B.** was born February 19, 1903 to Millard L. and Gussie M. Babb. They lived at 616 8<sup>th</sup> Street North as shown in the 1920 school census. Bernice took the general course of study in high school. She married Royal V. **MACDONALD** on January 1, 1926, in Cascade County. At the time of their marriage, a news story reported that she had been employed as a school teacher in Lewistown. In the 1940 U.S. Census, Bernice and family lived in University Park, Dallas, Texas, where her husband was a District Manager for an appliance store. In 1935 they were living in Kansas City (SC; Great Falls Tribune, January 2, 1926, p. 12; U.S. Census). ~

**BAKER, William Street** was born July 11, 1902 in St. Louis, Missouri. By 1921 his father, William P. Baker, was deceased, and his mother, Mary E. (Wright) lived at 322 4<sup>th</sup> Street North in Great Falls. William took the general course of study in high school. In the fall of 1921 he was listed in a group of Great Falls High School graduates who planned to attend Montana State College at Bozeman. William S. Baker died of scarlet fever while a student at Montana State College in Bozeman on March 19, 1923. He was buried at Highland Cemetery (George Company records, # 4294).~

**BALYEAT, Ernest H.** was born to Carrie H. and Grace E. (White) Balyeat on November 6, 1902. He majored in the Scientific course of study at Great Falls High School. In the fall of 1921 he was listed with a group of '21 graduates planning to attend Montana State University at Missoula. He married Ruth N. **LEASE** on October 5, 1924 at Great Falls; they had two daughters according to Cascade County birth records. By the time of the 1930 U.S. Census he and his family lived in Port Townsend, Washington where he was an assistant manager in a department store. In 1940 they lived in San Jose, California, where he was a manager in a store. By that time he and Ruth also had a son. Ruth died at age 66 at Palo Alto, California (1969); her obituary noted that they had lived in California for more than 30 years. She had been an elementary school teacher for much of her life. Ernest died March 25, 1998, and was buried at the Ukiah Cemetery. After Ruth's death he had married to Charlotte Pittinger Brest—she also preceded him in death. Ernest was very community-minded, and was also celebrated as an avid tree-planter, noted for creating a forest along California's Highway 1. (SC; Cascade County Marriages; Ancestry.com; obituary, Ukiah Daily Journal, May 26, 1969, p. 6; March 29, 1998, p. 12).~

**BANTA, Norman Simon A.** was born October 16, 1904 in Great Falls, according to Cascade County birth records. He took the general course of study in high school. When he died at Beaumont, Texas, February 3, 1981, his occupation was listed as chemical engineer for Union 76 Oil Company, and he was a widower. He was buried at Forest Lawn Memorial Park in Beaumont. The informant on his certificate was Norman Banta, Jr. (Cascade County Birth Register; SC; TX Death Certificate; Findagrave.com).~



**BARRETT, Bertha** (b. February 8, 1903) had majored in the Domestic Science course of study at Great Falls High School. She still lived with parents Thomas P. (a fireman) and Annie, at 826 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue South, according to the 1923 city directory. She was a stenographer at the Paris Store. Also in the family home in 1923 were siblings Alta, Elta, Helen, and Laura. Bertha was still in Great Falls in 1925, but by 1927 was no longer listed in the city directory. An obituary in the June 24, 1927 *Great Falls Tribune* reported that her father, a water department employee, had been shot and killed in an altercation with Henry Jacques. At the time of his death, Bertha was noted as living in San Francisco.

She married Joseph **FEASTER** in 1950 and moved to Seattle. Eight years before her death, she moved to Great Falls; her niece was Polly Kolstad, who helped her move back. Bertha's obituary noted that she had never had children of her own, but believed in the importance of education. She had worked and saved much during her lifetime. Her last work experiences were in real estate; she is well-known in Great Falls as a philanthropist. At the time of Bertha's death in 2005 (age 102), she left wonderful legacies for several Great Falls organizations—the Great Falls Education Foundation (\$797,257.00), Great Falls Central Catholic High School (\$797,257.00), Great Falls Symphony (\$109,990.00), and CM Russell Museum (\$109,990.00). (SD; CD; *Great Falls Tribune*, p. 1; *Great Falls Tribune*, April 11, 2006, p. 3, 5).~

**BELL, Lydia Rue** took the general course of study in high school. On December 31, 1922 she was living in Devil's Lake, Oregon, when she came back to Great Falls briefly to be a wedding attendant for Miss Glenrose Honey. She was probably a school teacher in Salem, Oregon, before marrying Charles **HAYS** of Portland. They had a son in February, 1926. According to Findagrave.com, both Lydia and her husband are interred at Bellcrest Memorial Park, Salem, Oregon (*Great Falls Tribune*, p. 18; *Statesman Journal*, Salem, Oregon, February 6, 1926, p. 6; Findagrave.com #72984649). ~

**BERGSTROM, Ellis** was born to Nels P. and Amanda K. Bergstrom on November 8, 1902. They lived at 618 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue North. Ellis took the general course of study in high school. On November 5, 1930, he married Edith **MILLER** at Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas, México. In the 1940 U.S. Census at Jefferson, Wisconsin, he was noted as divorced and an inmate in a county home. He died in July, 1987, in Jefferson, Wisconsin. (U.S. Census; CD; SC; Tamaulipas, Mexico Civil Registration Marriages, 1860-1950; Findagrave.com).~

**BRIDGEMAN, Dorothy Ann** took the general course of study in high school. In the fall of 1921 she was listed in a group of graduates planning to attend Montana State University at Missoula. She was a stenographer at the family drugstore in 1923. By then, her father Morris was deceased and her mother, Clara S., ran the Bridgeman Drug Store. They lived at 515 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue North. She married Alex **GORDON** in Cascade County on September 29, 1926. In April, 1940, she and Alex and their daughter were living in Great Falls, where Alex had the Glass Art Shop. By April, 1940, Dr. Bill Charteris, a physician, had his own practice in Sitka, Alaska; his wife was there with him. He died on April 19, 1968, and was buried in the veterans' cemetery at Sitka, Alaska. His gravestone notes that he was a Major in the U.S. Marine Corps. **CHELLQUIST, Eva Mathilda** was born August 15, 1904 to Bert and Sophia, at 411 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue South. In the fall of 1921, the *Tribune* listed her along with two others from her class, going to teacher training at Dillon Normal. Eva took the general course of study in high school. In 1923 she was listed in the city directory as a student, living at home. In 1942, she registered a car in Portland, Oregon, where she was living. **DICKSON, Alice Pearl** majored in the commercial course of study at GREAT FALLS HIGH SCHOOL. Born July 17, 1903 at Hobson, Montana, her father was William Smith Dickson and her mother was Florence White Dickson. She was married August 10, 1921, to Robert H. **SWAIN**, Jr. By the time of the 1940 Census they had children Shirley, Dorothy, and Bernard. Robert Swain was an auto shop machinist, and Alice was a housewife. She died November 28, 1999 at Great Falls and was buried at Highland Cemetery. (MT Marriages; Findagrave.com).~

**DORRANCE, Helen** was a stenographer living at the Woodworth Apartments in 1923. Helen majored in the commercial course of study at Great Falls High School. In the fall of 1921, she was planning to attend Montana State University at Missoula. Helen Dorrance Alcorn died at Spokane, Washington, in April, 1972; she had lived there for more than 40 years, according to her obituary. She was buried at Riverside Cemetery in Spokane. **EDMONSON, Eleanor** was born September 24, 1903 according to the school census of 1920. Eleanor had plans to attend Goucher College in the fall of 1921. According to a Montana marriage license dated July 31, 1937, he lived in Miles City, and on that day married Pansy R. **MCMILLAN** (age 24) at Fallon. **JORGENSEN, Robert Fulton**, born November 27, 1902, had parents Rasmus and Karen Jorgensen who lived at 309 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue South in Fall, 1920. He married Frances **BURLEIGH**. He was noted as the manager of a bottling works in Great Falls in the 1930 U.S. Census. He and Frances were listed as late as 1991 in the city directories. He died January 22, 1996 in Great Falls and was buried in Highland Cemetery; his wife died in 2001. (SC; MT Marriages; Findagrave.com; U.S. Census). ~

**KENNEDY, Doris M.** was born December 24, 1904, to Walter J. and Elsie (Leland) Kennedy. They lived at 2 12<sup>th</sup> Street North in Fall, 1920. Her sister Helen was also in the Class of 1921. Doris took the general course of study in high school and was a member of the "Honor Ten" in the class. In the fall of 1921 she was listed in a group of graduates planning to attend Montana State University at Missoula. Doris married Herbert M. **WHITE** on October 21, 1926, in Great Falls. In 1935 they lived in Havre, Montana; by April, 1940, they were living in Bozeman and had two daughters. Herbert was the publisher of the local newspaper. Doris died February 11, 1969 at San Mateo, California. (SC, U.S. Census; MT Marriages, *Great Falls Tribune*, California Death Index).~

**KENNEDY, Helen June** was born June 15, 1903 according to the 1920 school census. Her sister Doris M. Kennedy was also in the Class of 1921. Her parents were Walter J. and Elsie (Leland) Kennedy. Helen took the general course of study in high school. In the fall of 1921 she was listed in a group of graduates planning to attend Montana State University at Missoula. She married Robert Medley **WATERS** on January 14, 1929 in Great Falls. By 1930 this family lived in Billings, where they apparently stayed through at least 1940. Helen died on December 27, 2000, at Bozeman, Montana and was buried at Mountview Cemetery in Billings, where her husband was buried in 1980. Carl took the general course of study in high school and was a member of the "Honor Ten" in his graduating class. In a September, 1921 *Tribune* story, he was noted as planning to attend the University of California, Berkeley that fall. Karl was listed in the 1923 Great Falls city directory as an assistant chemist at the Royal Milling Company. He was living at Berkeley when he married Ruth Elizabeth **HANSEN** on September 22, 1930; he listed his occupation as research chemist. In 1940, he was listed as a petroleum research accountant, had a wife named Bernice, and two stepsons with a surname of Bengston. They lived in Inglewood, Los Angeles, California. **LORD, Evelyn Elliott** was born to Dr. Bertram E. and Jennie M. Lord on December 23, 1902 in Minnesota. The family was noted as living at 912 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue North in the 1920 Great Falls School Census. Evelyn graduated from the general course of study in high school. In Fall, 1921, the *Tribune's* story on recent graduates noted that she was planning to attend the University of Minnesota. In the 1930 Cascade County Census she was living with her parents and worked as a trained nurse. She married John Ellsworth **BAKER** on April 28, 1935 in Cascade County. In the 1940 census, she and her dentist husband (age 62) were living in Great Falls and her stepson lived with them—Evelyn was not working. Her parents, Bertram E. died in 1969, and Jennie M. died in 1966. Evelyn was buried in Great Falls; her death occurred January 12, 1989. **MADER, Mary Ellen**, daughter of William and Cora (Oswald) Mader, was born October 4, 1902, according to the 1920 school census. The family lived at 401 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue South in Fall, 1920, and operated a boarding house. Mary Ellen majored in the commercial course of study Great Falls High School. She died on April 5, 1996 at Merced, California and was buried at Turlock Memorial Park in California; her surname was **CHURCHILL**. (SC; U.S. Census; Findagrave.com). ~

**MARZETTA, Peter N.**, son of Emil and Louisena Marzetta, was born on Christmas, 1903. The family lived at 1209 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue North in the fall of 1920. Peter took the general course of study in high school. In the fall of 1921 he was listed in a group of Great Falls High School graduates who planned to attend Montana State College at Bozeman. In the 1930 census, he was living in a Great Falls boarding house and was employed as a gambler in a card room. In 1940 he was a liquor store operator, single, at Kevin, Montana and reported attending one year of college. He enlisted in the Army at Missoula on June 16, 1942 and was single. His gravestone indicates that he was a sergeant in WW II. He died May 13, 1975 at Fort Harrison and was buried at Mt. Olivet Cemetery in Great Falls. (SC; U.S. Census; Findagrave.com; WW II Army Enlistment Records).~

**MATZ, Lewis or Louis** was born to parents John and Kate on April 3, 1903. They lived at 525 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue Southwest in Fall, 1920. Lewis took the general course of study in high school. In the fall of 1921 he was listed in a group of graduates planning to attend Montana State University at Missoula. Louis married Sarah **BROWN**, October 6, 1927 at a Catholic church in Great Falls. He noted that he was divorced on his marriage certificate when he married Mabel **CROGHAN** at Helena on January 10, 1938. He was working for the Great Northern Railroad as a machinist in 1944 at Everett, Washington and Mabel was in the household. They lived in Havre in 1947. He began employment with the Chicago & North Western Railroad (CNW) in November, 1949 according to an employment form. There is a gravestone for Louis F. Matz at Mt. Olivet Cemetery in Great Falls, dating death as August,

1953. Mabel, widow of Louis, lived in Omaha, Nebraska in 1954, 1957-1958. (SC; CD; U.S. Census; *Great Falls Tribune*; MT Marriages; CNW Social Security Application).~

**McIVER, Kenneth B.** was born to parents K.B. and Viola (Vaughn) McIver on December 23, 1903, and died on his birthday in 1968 at Great Falls. He majored in the Scientific course of study at Great Falls High School. In the fall of 1921 he was listed in a group of Great Falls High School graduates who planned to attend Montana State College at Bozeman. His obituary in the *Great Falls Tribune* on Christmas Day, 1968, told of his graduation from Montana State College in 1925. He and two siblings incorporated a family dairy in 1934, calling it the Pioneer Dairy. Later, he had a feedlot operation and a ranch business. He was community-minded, serving as president of the Great Falls Chamber of Commerce, president of the Great Falls Rotary Club, and Chairman of the Cascade County American Red Cross organization. He married Genevieve **COOLEY** on September 12, 1928 and they settled in Great Falls. They had one son, Bruce, and three daughters. Genevieve died on October 10, 1987. (SC; *Great Falls Tribune*; Findagrave.com).

**McNAIR, Benedict P., Jr.**, son of Ben P. and Marion McNair, was born September 9, 1902. The family home was at 306 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue North in Fall, 1920. Ben took the general course of study in high school. According to a September, 1921 *Tribune* update, he planned to attend Leland Stanford University in California. He and his brother Chester and W. R. Gilchrist had a real estate and insurance partnership until 1952. Ben Jr. then became associated with his father-in-law's Burd Oil Company at Cut Bank. Ben, Jr., died in his sleep at Laguna Beach, California on November 30, 1963, and his wife Eloise (Burd) died just months later; they are both interred in the Urn Garden at New Highland Cemetery. **MILLER, Fay Ada** was born June 18, 1900, to Stonewall J. and Sidney Annie (Newman) Miller in Indian Territory, Oklahoma. The 1900 census shows Stonewall, wife Sidney, and children at Township 18, Creek Nation, Indian Territory, verifying this birth place. In Fall, 1920, the family lived at 2100 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue North. Fay took the general course of study in high school. Her father, Stonewall, was a city laborer while they lived in Great Falls. She had siblings Albert, Leonard, and Mary. In 1930 she lived with her parents and siblings in Portland, Multnomah, Oregon and was employed as a laundry folder. In the 1940 Portland census Ada Fay was single, still living in her mother's household and was employed as a laundry bookkeeper. (SC; U.S. Census).

**MOCK, Gerald F.** was born February 25, 1903 at Denver, to Frank B. and Irma Mock. In 1920 the family home was simply listed as "Sun River". In the fall of 1921 he was listed in a group of Great Falls High School graduates who planned to attend Montana State College at Bozeman; he had majored in the high school's Manual Training course of study. Gerald later married Hilda **BILLSTROM**. By 1940, they had two children. That U.S. Census noted that he had attended one year of college. He died November 20, 1940, at St. James Hospital in Butte of cancer. He was buried in Highland Cemetery in Great Falls. (SC; Silver Bow County Death Certificate; George Company records; U.S. Census).~

**MONROE, Frank E.** took the general course of study in high school. Frank married Esther V. **STEADMAN** on October 15, 1930. In 1935 they were still living in Great Falls. According to his memorial stone, he was born in 1903, to Carlton "Matt" Monroe and Marris Belcourt Monroe in the Choteau area and died October 12, 1945. He was buried at Mt. Olivet Cemetery in Great Falls. (Choteau Acantha obituary, March 5, 1935; SC; CD; Findagrave.com).~

**MOREHEAD, Jessie Mae**, born December 7, 1899, was the daughter of George R. and Rebecca A. Morehead. In 1920 the family residence was listed as 1509 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue South. She had majored in Domestic Science at Great Falls High School. In the fall of 1921 she was listed in a group of Great Falls High School graduates who planned to attend Montana State College at Bozeman. Jessie later married Carl S. **JOHNSON** in Cascade County, on June 28, 1924 Their son George, born in Great Falls, died at Tucson, Arizona on July 12, 1931 and was interred there at Evergreen Cemetery. (SC; *Great Falls Tribune*; MT Marriages; AZ Death Certificates).~



**MOSES, Mildred Odelle** was a stenographer living at 212 North 14<sup>th</sup> in 1923 (CD). Mildred took the general course of study in high school. In the fall of 1921 she was listed in a group of graduates planning to attend MONTANA STATE UNIVERSITY at Missoula. In April, 1930 she was listed with her parents, who lived in Ward 4, Great Falls. Her father Ruben worked as a clerk at the Smelter. Her mother was Susie M. and Mildred, age 28, worked as a "Comptometer Operator" for an express company. In 1940 her father was listed as an accountant at the zinc plant and her mother was also in the home. (SC; U.S. Census; *Great Falls Tribune*).~

**NELSON, Paul L.**, was born January 18, 1902 to Rev. Walter B. and Mabel E. Nelson. The family home was at 11 16<sup>th</sup> Street North in the 1920 school census. Paul took the general course of study in high school. In the fall of 1921 he was listed in a group of Great Falls High School graduates who planned to attend Montana State College at Bozeman. Paul, husband of Marion, died August 16, 1936 at Vaughn, Montana. He was interred at Hillcrest Lawn Mausoleum in Great Falls. (SC; *Great Falls Tribune* article; Findagrave.com).~

**NOBLE, Helen**, daughter of Robert B. and Lottie Johnson Noble, was born March 31, 1903. In the fall of 1921 she was listed in a group of Great Falls High School graduates who planned to attend Montana State College at Bozeman. She had majored in the commercial course of study at Great Falls High School. Helen was a clerk at the Noble Mercantile in Great Falls in 1925. She was married to Harry E. **FRYER** on April 7, 1927 in Cascade County. She was living in Butte on May 31, 1939. (SC; CD; MT Marriages; *Great Falls Tribune* article; Early Settlers of Great Falls).

**OAKLAND, Du Wayne Thomas**, born August 24, 1902 to Thomas and Rebecca J. Oakland, lived at 617 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue North in Fall, 1920. He was a twin to Helen. These twins took the general course of study in high school. He married Emma M. **COLARCHIK** (1905-1998). He died November 15, 1996 in Green Valley, Arizona; both he and his spouse were interred at New Highland Cemetery in Great Falls. (SC; Social Security Death Index; Findagrave.com). ~

**OAKLAND, Helen**, born August 24, 1902 in Great Falls to Thomas and Rebecca J. Oakland, lived at 617 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue North in the fall of 1920. She was a twin to Du Wayne. Helen took the general course of study in high school. She married Edward **BAILEY** on May 7, 1927 at Seattle; DuWayne was a witness to her marriage. Helen Oakland Bailey died on January 14, 1946 and was interred at Highland Cemetery in Great Falls. (Washington State Digital Archives; SC; Findagrave.com).~

**O'BRIEN, Robert Emmett** planned to attend Gonzaga beginning Fall, 1921. According to the school census of 1920, Robert was born September 11, 1904, to Jerry and Helen K. O'Brien. The family lived at 1412 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue North. He majored in the Scientific course of study at Great Falls High School. In 1930 he and his wife Leone were living in Pocatello, Idaho, and he was a salesman. According to the 1940 U.S. census taken at Oakland, Alameda, California, Robert and his wife Leone had lived in Great Falls in 1935; he was a poultry dealer and had completed four years of college. He was also asked supplementary questions in that census, which provided ancestral information about his parentage. (SC; *Great Falls Tribune* article; U.S. Census).~

**OLINGER, Madelyne Alice**, born February 17, 1902 to George C. and Hannah Jane Olinger, lived at the family home at 1318 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue North in the fall of 1920, along with her parents and several siblings. She was planning to attend a Women's College at Jacksonville, Illinois, in Fall, 1921. She married Mathias **MATHESON** at Billings on January 1, 1930. In the 1940 Census taken at Jacksonville, Illinois, she was again using the surname Olinger, was a lodger, and said she had been living in Great Falls in 1935. She married Clarence M. **ANDERSON** in Great Falls on April 2, 1943. She died March 28, 1993, as shown in the Social Security Death Index; she was buried in the Ollinger plot at Highland. (SC; U.S. Census; *Great Falls Tribune*; MT County Marriages, 1865-1950; Findagrave.com).~
