New For You In The Genealogy Library

1885-1906 Cascade County Death Index Finished

Prior to now, finding deaths in Cascade County for this span of years has been hit-and-miss, as no index existed. Great Falls and other county records prior to Cascade County's formation in 1887 were recorded (if at all) in Chouteau County. Montana death certificates were not required until 1907, so reports of deaths were dependent on local newspaper columns, individual death stories, and the like. There were no consistent reports from early funeral homes, either.

Jan Thomson started a project to make a death index spanning the years 1885-1906 for Cascade County; her goal was to identify deaths, the information available, and the funeral homes (where available). This index has been (tentatively) finished, although it is very likely that other deaths will be identified as families report other deaths of that period and place.

GFGS makes no guarantee that these are all of the deaths; please send reports of known deaths to the Society for inclusion in this index. As the Index was completed, published obits, brief death notices and available information from sources were gathered into 3-ring binders and these are now available at the GFGS Library and at our website.

IMPROVEMENTS AT THE FAMILY HISTORY LIBRARY IN SALT LAKE CITY

Two of us from GFGS traveled to the Salt Lake City Family History Library (FHL) last week; our purpose was a brief research trip now that the Library has reopened. Carolyn Cornelius and I spent two days on the third floor, where all U.S./Canada books are now located. We were delighted by the changes they had for us!

The FHL has changed quite a bit; all European and British Empire books are now found together on Floor B2; Floor B1 contains all international microfilms and a “Global Maps Area”, and materials are easier than ever to find! Floor 1 is still an exploration center for those just becoming acquainted with family history and genealogy. Wowie, they have stocked the book shelves with nearly 50,000 more books - a pure delight!

Reference desks are right across from the elevators on each floor. New tables and new computer stations are - each floor has several Czur scanning stations (we have been using a Czur scanner for several years as we scan Ursuline Archives materials here in Great Falls).
