The mission of the Great Falls Genealogy Society is to promote and encourage active interest in genealogy, compile accurate and complete genealogies, collect and preserve genealogical records and sponsor and operate the Great Falls Genealogy Society Library. Additionally, the Society fosters education and training in genealogy through courses and instruction in genealogy, lectures, forums, seminars, and special work.

Monthly meetings are held September through May and are open to the public. Workshops are held throughout the year, some via ZOOM. Check our schedule at our website.

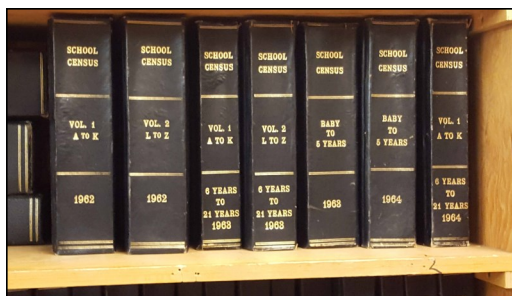
GENEALOGICAL RESOURCES AVAILABLE AT THE GREAT FALLS GENEALOGY SOCIETY LIBRARY

Everyone is welcome to use our library resources. As we are a reference library, our collection is for use only in the library.

Some examples of our collection:

Cascade County Resources including:

- Birth records 1893-1919, Birth index through 1975
- Coroner records, 1893-1984
- Inquests, 1887-1991
- Marriage certificates and books, 1887-1967
- Cemetery Transcriptions through 2012
- School censuses, 1896-2005
- Rural school records, Cascade County
- Old Age Pension Applications, 1923-1938



Canadian Provincial Resources: This includes histories, immigration records, and French Canadian journals.

Directories: The collection holds all known directories for Great Falls and directories for other Montana cities and communities. It also includes Church directories, rural community and farm directories and brand books.

Church Directories: The library has a large collection of church directories, primarily from Montana, including directories and church histories from many denominations, including Catholic, Lutheran, Episcopalian, Methodist, First Church of the Nazarene, Hutterites, Mennonites, Baptists, and more.

Indian Nations of Montana, the United States and Canada including: tribal histories and records from Little Shell Band, Metis, Assiniboine, Blackfeet, Cherokee, Cheyenne, Chippewa Cree, Crow, Flathead, Gros Ventre, Kalispel, Kootenai, Lakota, Nez Perce, Salish, and Sioux.

Yearbook Collection: includes Great Falls High School, C.M. Russell High School, Centerville High School, Belt High School, Great Falls Catholic schools and Montana colleges. Also reunion materials.

Our general Montana collection extends across 56 counties and includes histories, cemetery transcriptions, city and county directories, news clippings, scrapbooks, yearbooks and genealogy society publications.
